
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

#### STATEMENT

Second Lieutenant Ibar M. Spellacy Jr., 0-710521, was pilot of aircraft #42-51587, on a combat mission to bomb marshalling yards in Vienna, Austria on 13 October 1944. Just after passing over the target at approximately 480 00 N, 160 30 E, the aircraft was seen to leave the formation and go down, losing altitude rapidly. It is not known whether the airplane crashed or continued on course. There were no eyewitnesses as to the exact time the airplane left the formation, though it is generally believed that it did so in the target area, shortly after bombs away. Aircraft last sighted at approximately 1155 hours.

No information has been received from Lieutenant Spellacy up to this time and the undersigned has no opinion as to their fate.

#### STATEMENT

I was tail gunner on 2nd Lt., Jackson's aircraft flying in position number 6, in the first flight of our formation, on the combat mission on the Marshalling Yards in Vienna Austria on 13 October 1944.

2nd Lt., Spellacy in the Aircraft with the revetment number fifty (50) was flying in position number 7. Just as we passed over Vienna, in the Flak area directly over the target, I last saw Lt. Spellacy's aircraft. I know no further details.
